The Fort Worth Nature Center and Refuge (FWNC&R) is nestled in the northwest corner of Fort Worth off of Jacksboro Highway (TX 199 West). The FWNC&R is a hidden jewel, a wilderness comprised of forests, prairies, and wetlands reminiscent of how much of the Fort Worth/Dallas Metroplex once looked.

Over 3,600 acres, the FWNC&R is one of the largest city-owned nature centers in the United States and offers residents and visitors the opportunity to immerse themselves in the natural history of north central Texas. Over 20 miles of hiking trails provide easy access to a myriad of natural wonders to be found on the Refuge.



The FWNC&R offers onsite and offsite educational programs. We are currently scheduling school groups for onsite and offsite programs. Nature Center staff and docents will guide you around our trails discussing local flora and fauna adaptations for your onsite experience. With any luck, you may see a Texas Spiny Lizard scurrying across the path or a White-tailed Deer hiding amongst the grasses. Nature Center staff and educational animals will also come and visit your classroom. We conduct *live reptile* and *mammal* programs. Very soon, we will have a *live owl* program as well.
